SYLLABUS

Course Code: EMB 09: Translation - Theory and Practice

This course would attempt to make the students aware of the need, ethics and the practice of Translation. It would discuss some major theories of translation in the West and in India along with the practical experience of translation from certain Indian regional literatures into English. The course has two major components:

• Theories of Translation

Western: This would include theoretical concepts related to interlingual, intralingual and semiotic translations. It would include discussions on Equivalence, Skopos theory, Cultural Translation. An attempt will be made to acquaint the students with the works of Susan Bassnett, Sherry Simon, Lawrence Venuti and others.

Indian: This would include discussions on Indian engagement with translation in the colonial and the post-colonial eras.

• Practice

The course would include workshop(s) on translation from the regional languages such as Rajbanshi, Bodo, Nepali, etc into English as a project done by the students.
