Syllabus of M.A. in English under Credit Based Choice System

- 1 THE FOLLOWING WOULD BE THE SYLLABUS OF M.A. IN ENGLISH PROGRAMME UNDER CBCS SYSTEM FROM 2020-21 SESSION ONWARDS. TOTAL CREDITS FOR THE M.A PROGRAMME WILL BE 80 CREDITS. EACH SEMESTER WILL REQUIRE COMPLETION OF 20 CREDITS.
- 2 EACH COURSE WILL BE OF 5 CREDITS. 1 CREDIT WILL BE EQUIVALENT TO THE DIRECT LECTURE OF 1 HOUR PER WEEK.
- 3 THERE WILL BE TWO TYPES OF COURSES:
 A] CORE COURSES, MARKED IN CODE AS "CC". THESE WILL BE MANDATORY FOR ALL STUDENTS OF M.A IN ENGLISH.

B] ELECTIVE COURSES: THESE ARE OFFRED IN A CAFETERIA-MENU APPROACH TO STUDENTS TO SELECT FROM, TOWARD FORMING A SPECIALIZATION OF KNOWLEDGE. THERE ARE TWO TYPES OF ELECTIVES:

I] **DISCIPLINE CENTRIC ELECTIVES** [ABBREVIATED AS DCE]: THESE WILL BE OFFERED ONLY TO THE STUDENTS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH. TEACHING, LEARNING AND ANSWERS MUST BE IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE.

II] **GENERIC ELECTIVES** [ABBREVIATED AS GE]: THESE WILL BE OPEN FOR ALL MASTER'S LEVEL STUDENTS OF THE FACULTY OF ARTS, IRRESPECTIVE OF THEIR DEPARTMENTS. HOWEVER, RECOGNITION AND PERMISSION FROM THE MOTHER DEPARTMENT WILL BE NECESSARY. TEACHING AND LEARNING WILL OFTEN BE BILINGUAL OR MULTILINGUAL, AND QUESTIONS WILL BE IN ENGLISH WHILE THE STUDENTS CAN ANSWER IN EITHER BENGALI OR ENGLISH.

- 4 WHEREEVER AND WHENEVER, THERE IS AN OPTION OF CHOICE INDICATED IN THE SYLLABUS BY THE CONJUNCTION/CONNECTIVE "OR", IT IMPLIES THAT THE RESPECTIVE COURSE TEACHER WILL, THROUGH A PRIORI WRITTEN NOTIFICATION WELL BEFORE THE COMMENCEMENT OF CLASSES, CHOOSE AT THE DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH, COOCH BEHAR PANCHANAN BARMA UNIVERSITY, COOCH BEHAR, ANY OF THE SPECIFIED OPTIONS FOR THAT PARTICULAR SEMESTER OF THAT SESSION. THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE BOARD OF STUDIES IN ENGLISH [PG] WILL COMMUNICATE THIS PARTICULAR CHOICE TO THE AFFILIATED COLLEGES WHEREBY M.A. IN ENGLISH PROGRAMME IS RUNNING. QUESTIONS IN ANY OF THE EXAMINATIONS RELEVANT TO THAT SEMESTER WILL BE SET FROM THAT PARTICULAR CHOSEN OPTION ONLY.
- 5 WHEREVER AND WHENEVER, THERE IS A MENTION OF "ANY" IN THE SYLLABUS, IT IMPLIES THAT THE RESPECTIVE COURSE TEACHER IS FREE TO CHOOSE IN THE ABOVE MENTIONED WAY [NARRATED IN CLAUSE-3 ABOVE], AND SUCH CHOICE WILL BE COMMUNICATED TO THE RELEVANT AFFILIATED COLLEGES BY THE CHAIRPERSON OF BOARD OF STUDIES IN ENGLISH [PG].
- 6 COURSE TEACHER CAN ADD NEW INSTANCES OR TOPICS OR TEXTS, BUT AS ADDITIONAL INCORPORATION ONLY. THESE CANNOT REPLACE THE ORIGINAL TOPICS OR TEXTS BY THE WAY OF "OR" THAT IS, SUBSTITUTION OR EXCHANGE. IN OTHER WORDS, COURSE

TEACHERS CAN NOT DELETE OR AVOID ANYTHING ALREADY MENTIONED IN THIS SYLLABUS.

- 7 NOTWITHSTANDING ANYTHING MENTIONED IN CLAUSE-4 ABOVE, NO TEXT THAT IS ALREADY OFFERED IN THE APPROVED SYLLABUS OF B.A. HONOURS AND B.A. PROGRAMME COURSES IN ENGLISH AT THE U.G. LEVEL CAN BE CHOSEN OR OFFERED IN M.A. IN ENGLISH, UNLESS ALREADY INCLUDED BY TITLE AS A COMPULSORY TEXT IN THE SYLLABUS GIVEN BELOW.
- 8 IN NO COURSE THE COURSE TEACHER SHALL INCLUDE A TEXT OR TOPIC ALREADY TAUGHT, OR, NAMED IN THE CONTENTS OF, ANY OTHER COURSE.
- 9 A MINIMUM OF 60 HOURS OF DIRECT LECTURES WILL BE OFFERED PER COURSE PER SEMESTER BY THE COURSE TEACHER. IN CASE IT FALLS SHORT OF THE BENCHMARK DUE TO SITUATIONS BEYOND PEDAGOGIC PERFORMANCE AND ROUTINE, SUCH AS PANDEMIC, EPIDEMIC, WAR, NATURAL DISASTER RECOGNISED BY THE UNIVERSITY AS SUCH ETCETERA, CURTAILMENT OF LECTURE HOURS AND OF THE SYLLABUS WILL REQUIRE APPROVAL OF BOARD OF STUDIES [PG], DEAN OF ARTS, REGISTRAR AND HONOURABLE VICE-CHANCELLOR, AND IF DEEMED NECESSARY BY COMPETENT AUTHORITIES, THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.
- 10 IN NO COURSES NAMED AND DETAILED BELOW, THERE IS ANY MANDATORY OR COMPULSORY PROVISION OF FIELDWORK [OUTSTATION] OR PERFORMATIVE WORKSHOP [WITH EXTERNAL RESOURCE PERSONS]. HOWEVER, IF THE COURSE TEACHER DEEMS IT NECESSARY, HE OR SHE CAN APPLY THROUGH PROPER CHANNEL FOR PARTIAL OR FULL MATCHING GRANT FOR SUCH PURPOSES FROM THE UNIVERSITY FUNDS ; IT WOULD BE SOLE DISCRETION OF THE UNIVERSITY'S COMPETENT AUTHORITIES TO ACCEPT OR REJECT SUCH PROPOSALS.
- 11 IN CASE OF DECREASE OR INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF TEACHERS IN THE FACULTY, THE SYLLABUS WILL STILL REMAIN THE CONSTANT, TILL A NEW SYLLABUS IS MADE AND APPROVED BY THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL. FOR ALLOCATION OF COURSES AMONGST THE COURSE TEACHERS, AT LEAST A WEEK BEFORE THE COMMENCEMENT OF CLASSES EVERY SEMESTER, A MEETING OF THE DEPARTMENTAL COMMITTEE IS REQUIRED TO DECIDE SUCH MATTERS.
- 12 STUDENTS WILL BE FREE TO CHOOSE THEIR ELECTIVES. NO COURSE TEACHER SHALL ADD SPECIAL FILTERS FOR INTAKE INTO THE COURSES, NOR SHALL THERE BE ANYTHING IN THE MANNER OF EVENT OR INDUCTION TO FORBID OR INFLUENCE THE CHOICE OF ELECTIVES BY THE RESPECTIVE STUDENTS. THIS WILL BE BINDING AS LONG AS THE SYLLABUS WILL CONTINUE TO BE IN EFFECT.

- 13 FOR ANY GENERIC COURSE, EVALUATION WILL BE UPON THE UNDERSTANDING AND ANALYSIS OF THE CONTENTS, AND NOT ON ACTUAL EXTRA-CURRICULAR SKILLS. FOR EXAMPLE, IN ENGMGE1 OF 3RD SEMESTER, EVALUATION WILL BE ON UNDERSTANDING AND ANALYSIS OF THE DANCE, AND NOT ON ANY ACTUAL DANCE-SKILLS OF ANY STUDENT.
- 14 FOR ANYTHING NOT MENTIONED IN THE SYLLABUS BELOW, THE REGULATIONS OF PG CBCS ADOPTED BY THE UNIVERSITY SHALL BE THE STANDARD REFERENCE FOR RESOLUTIONS.
- 15 ALL CORE AND ELECTIVE COURSES MENTIONED IN THE SYLLABUS WILL BE OFFERED IN RELEVANT SEMESTER.
